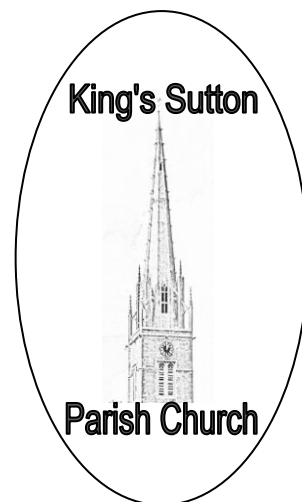

The bells will ring out.....

One hundred years ago, as news of the Armistice spread, church bells, which had fallen silent across the UK during the First World War, rang out in celebration.

Before 1914, the vast majority of bellringers in the UK were male, but the loss of so many men to war meant that many more women took up the role. Today there are between thirty to thirty-five thousand men and women tower bell ringers in the UK, and the aim is that bells sound out across the whole world on 11th November. This is a unique opportunity to show our appreciation for the generation who gave so much during this conflict.

Listen out for the bells of the Parish Church in the middle of the day at around 4.15pm, as bellringers here take their part in sounding out a peal of remembrance.

Inspiration for “For the Fallen”

Laurence Binyon composed his best known poem while sitting on the cliff-top looking out to sea from the dramatic scenery of the north Cornish coastline.

The poem was written in mid September 1914, a few weeks after the outbreak of the First World War.

Laurence said in 1939 that the four lines of the fourth stanza came to him first and it is these words that have become especially familiar and famous, having been adopted by the Royal British Legion as an Exhortation for ceremonies of Remembrance to commemorate fallen Servicemen and women.

Laurence was too old to enlist in the military forces but he went to work for the Red Cross as a medical orderly in 1916. He lost several close friends and his brother-in-law in the war.



For the Fallen

Poem by Robert Laurence Binyon (1869-1943), published in The Times newspaper on 21st September 1914.

With proud thanksgiving, a mother for her children,
England mourns for her dead across the sea.
Flesh of her flesh they were, spirit of her spirit,
Fallen in the cause of the free.

Solemn the drums thrill: Death august and royal
Sings sorrow up into immortal spheres.
There is music in the midst of desolation
And a glory that shines upon our tears.

They went with songs to the battle, they were young,
Straight of limb, true of eye, steady and aglow.
They were staunch to the end against odds uncounted,
They fell with their faces to the foe.

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old:
Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.
At the going down of the sun and in the morning
We will remember them.

They mingle not with their laughing comrades again;
They sit no more at familiar tables of home;
They have no lot in our labour of the day-time;
They sleep beyond England's foam.

But where our desires are and our hopes profound,
Felt as a well-spring that is hidden from sight,
To the innermost heart of their own land they are known
As the stars are known to the Night;

As the stars that shall be bright when we are dust,
Moving in marches upon the heavenly plain,
As the stars that are starry in the time of our darkness,
To the end, to the end, they remain.

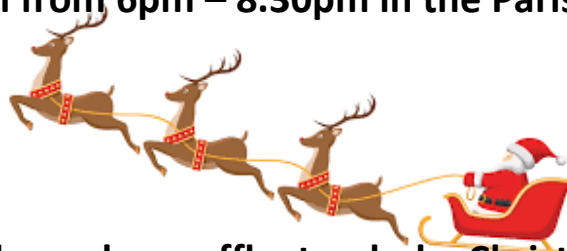

Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School



Come and join a businesslike, friendly and co-operative group of governors, working together to maintain high standards of education and care in our village school.

The Governing Board is looking for two 'Foundation' Governors. Ideally they would be church-going members of the Church of England, and their appointment would be ratified by the Diocese of Peterborough. We'd like to hear from people with experience in any of the following: financial management, human resources, premises management or marketing.

This year the school was rated 'good' by the latest Ofsted short inspection and 'Outstanding' by the SIAMS inspection carried out by the Diocese. ('The distinctiveness and effectiveness of Newbottle and Charlton as a Church of England school are outstanding') The atmosphere of the school is calm, happy and friendly. The children here have a thirst for knowledge and a love of learning and all the staff work in a supportive, family way to ensure children achieve their very best.

Newbottle and Charlton School is a Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary school, covering Reception to Year 6 (ages 4-11). There are currently 103 children on roll. The school is funded through the local authority and as a church school it belongs to the Peterborough Diocese. The school serves the villages of Charlton and Aynho predominately but children also come from a number of other local villages and towns.
